UPDATED: HPD Investigating Hot Vehicle Deaths of Toddlers

HINESVILLE, Ga. (September 30, 2019) – Hinesville Police Department (HPD) is currently working with the Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) regarding the deaths of two toddlers on Sunday, September 29.

At approximately 1:42 p.m. on Sunday, September 29, a 911 call was received stating that two children had been missing and were found unresponsive in a vehicle located in the backyard of a home in the Griffin Park neighborhood.

First responders arrived on scene shortly thereafter and discovered two toddlers inside the parked vehicle who were unresponsive. Upon further investigation, first responders determined that the children were deceased.

Once the determination had been made, HPD immediately began a death investigation. A perimeter was established and all individuals were removed from the home. Additionally, a search warrant for the home was obtained and GBI was contacted to assist with the investigation. A crime scene unit processed the scene with the assistance from GBI and the bodies of the children were removed from the scene and taken to the crime lab. Autopsies will be performed on Monday, September 30.

UPDATE: TUESDAY, OCTOBER 1:

The Hinesville Police Department is working to establish the timeline of events on Sunday, September 29 that led to the 911 call regarding two children found unresponsive inside a vehicle.

Earlier in the morning, the foster parent could not locate the children inside the home after searching. The search was expanded to the backyard and the surrounding area in the neighborhood. The foster parent returned to the home to resume the search and recheck the backyard. It was during this second search that the children were found unresponsive inside a vehicle parked in the home's backyard.

The victims have been identified as Raelynn Keyes (born 11.29.2015) and Payton Keyes (born 11.30.2015).
